

# The Complainant, Jockey Club Racecourses Limited,

is the owner of the registered UK trade mark FESTIVAL/THE FESTIVAL for racing and organisation of race meetings. In the view of the Expert, the Respondent took unfair advantage of the Complainant's rights in registering and using the domain name which might cause confusion for consumers. Domain transferred.



# The Complainant was The Bicycle Association of

bicycleassociation.co.uk

Great Britain Limited, and the end user of the domain name was a company called National Association of Cycle Traders Limited that uses the name Association of Cycle Traders (ACT). An appeal panel was satisfied that the ACT's use of the Domain Name was likely to cause confusion. Domain transferred.



britishredcross.org.uk

The Complainant was the registered charity British Red Cross. They argued that the unauthorised use of the Red Cross name is a criminal offence under the Geneva Conventions Act 1957. No Response was submitted, and a Summary Decision awarded the transfer of the domain name to the Complainant. Domain transferred.



### swegway.co.uk & swegwayboards.co.uk The Complainant in both cases was Segway Inc. Two

separate Respondents were using the domain names to sell other 'balance boards'. One Expert agreed that the term "Swegway" was taking unfair advantage of the Complainant's rights in the name Segway. The Expert in the second case argued the term "Swegway" has become a generic term describing personal mobility devices. These cases highlight that Experts are free to use their own interpretation of the facts to make their decision.







## In 2016 the DRS saw cases brought by complainants from 28 countries, with respondents from 35 countries.
