Nominet is accountable to our Members. The membership represents a diverse range of views and experiences in the UK internet community. Members feed in their insight through meetings, policy consultations, the Registry Advisory Council and directly elected board members.

Given the unique role Nominet plays as a Public Benefit organisation and as Critical National Infrastructure, we also consider and work closely with a range of stakeholders beyond our Members.

These include UK Government and the devolved administrations such as the Welsh Government; the UK's national security agencies such as the National Cyber Security Centre; regulators responsible for critical national infrastructure such as Ofcom; and our partnerships with Law Enforcement Agencies and bodies such as the Internet Watch Foundation, to keep the .UK domain free of criminal material.

We also work closely with the international internet community, such as ICANN, the ITU and IGF, to share ideas and represent .UK voices on a global stage.

Our work with partners helps us serve the changing needs of the millions of registrants who depend on our services, the wider digital economy and the public at large.

As a Public Benefit organisation, we also have vital stakeholders in the charitable and voluntary sector whom we work with to support our social impact work and compare learnings to ensure Nominet delivers the greatest social impact possible with the resource we have.

Our stakeholders include of course our people; we aim to create an inclusive and supportive environment for all who work at Nominet.
