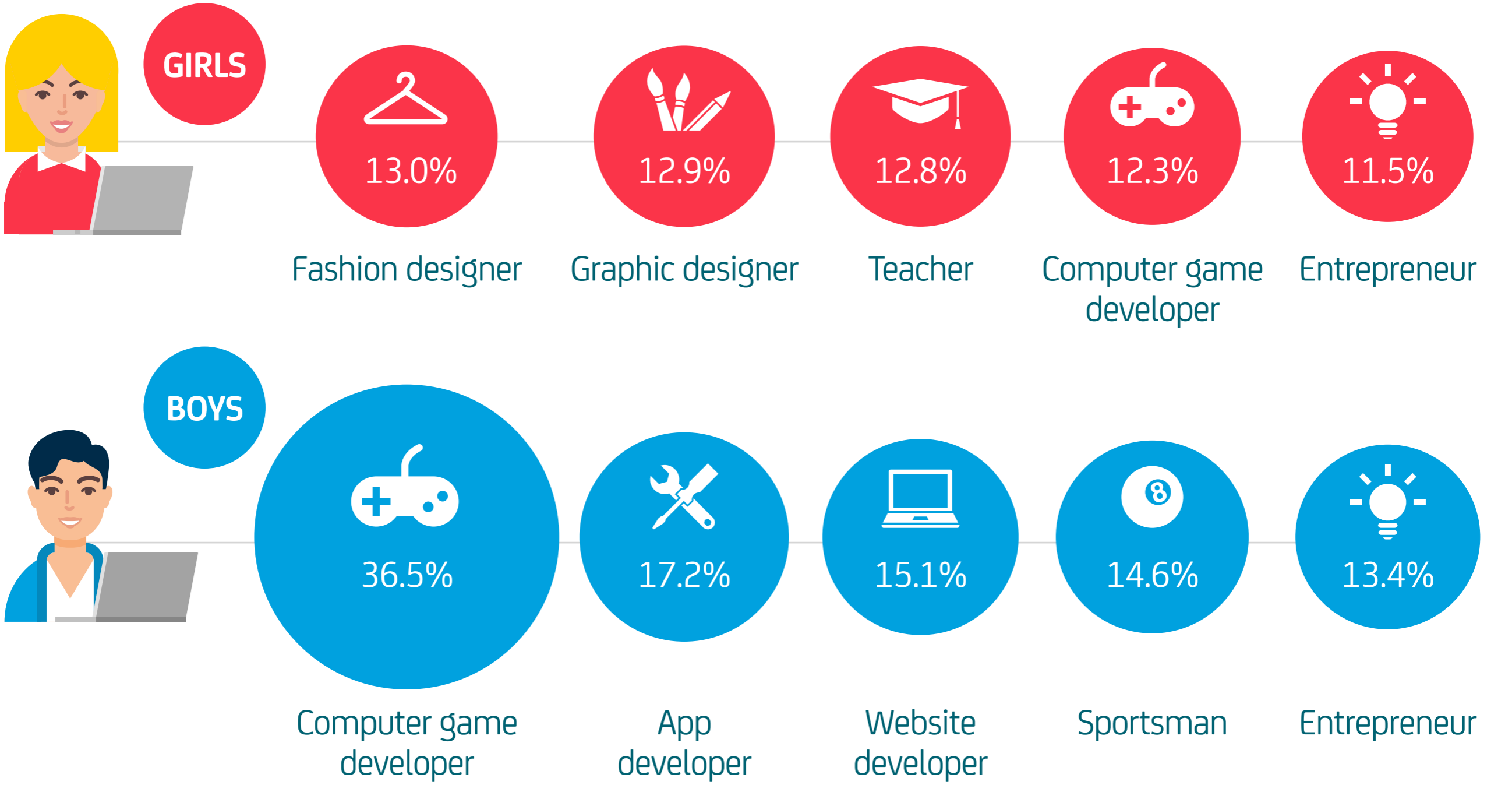

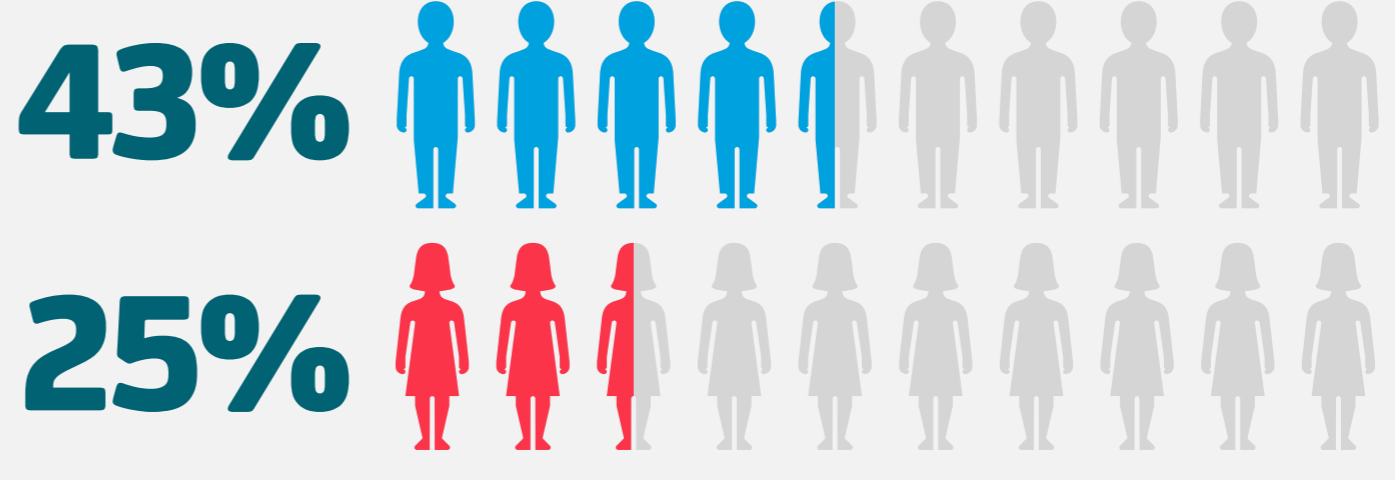
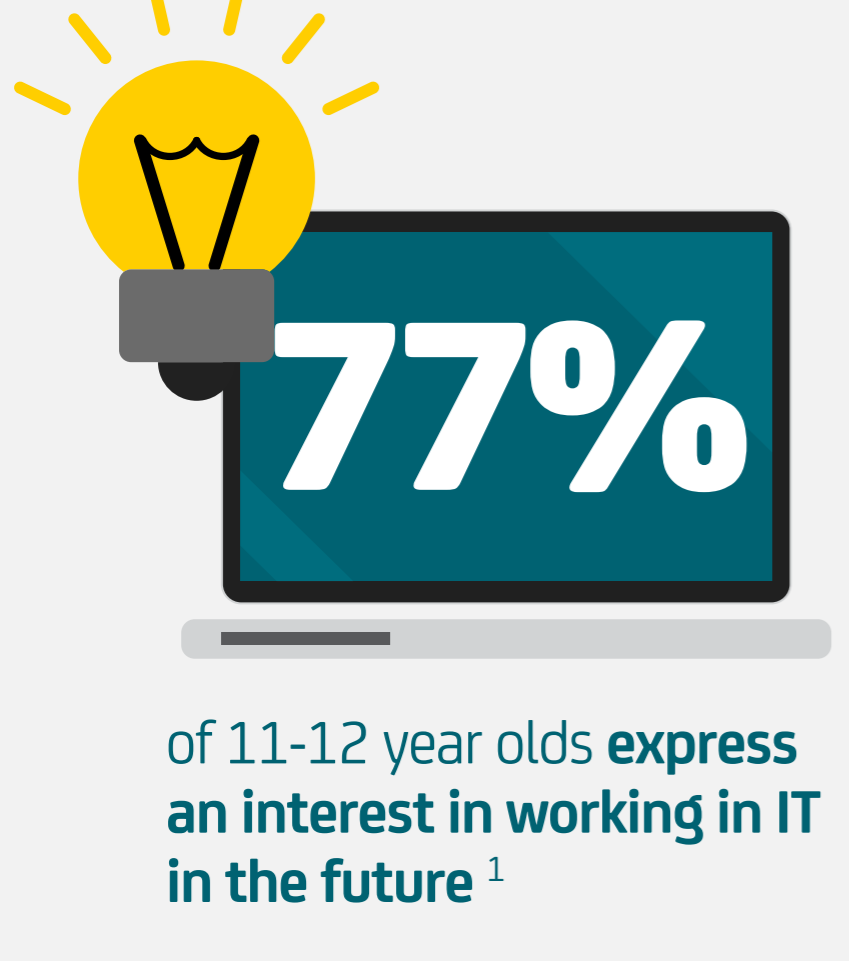


## I want to be a...

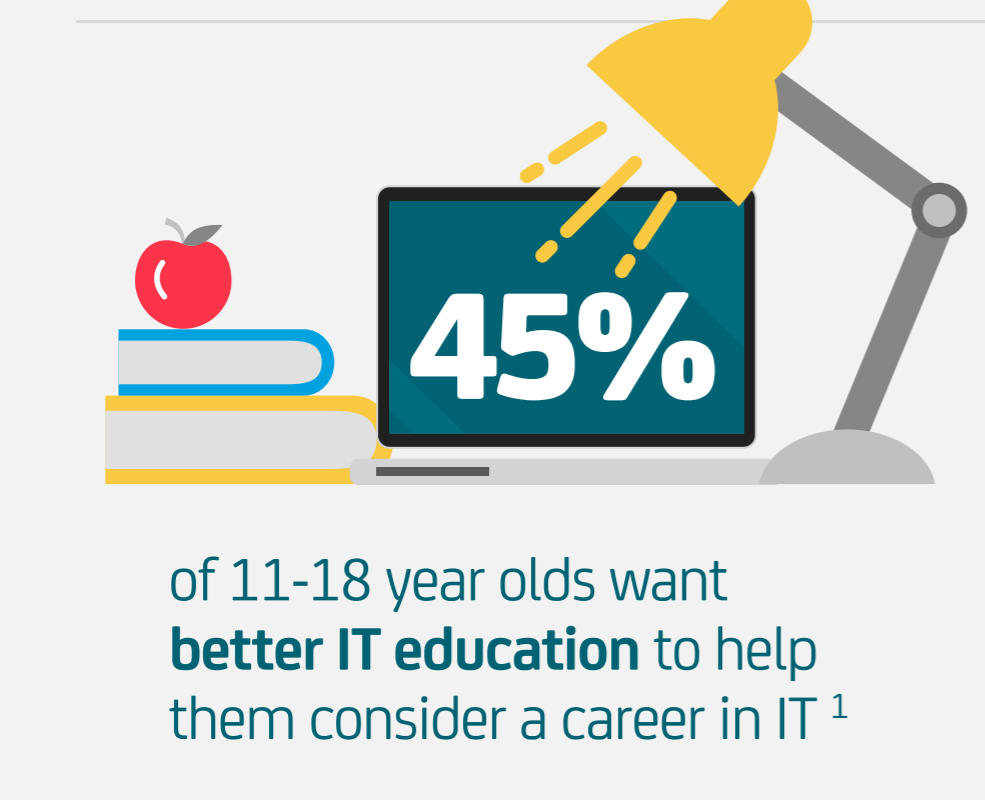


Traditional careers such as police officer, lawyer, doctor or nurse were half as appealing as tech developer roles among 11-18 year olds<sup>1</sup>

## In education...



Almost twice as many 11-18 year old boys (43%) as girls (25%) want to work in an IT department after completing formal education<sup>1</sup>



of 11-18 year olds think ICT will be the most useful subject for their career when they leave school<sup>1</sup>

## In the workplace...



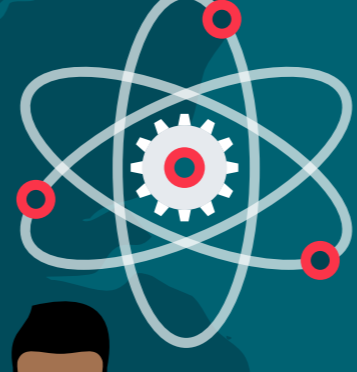
Women considered better coders – but only if they hide their gender<sup>3</sup>



Worldwide, women are a minority within tech leadership - accounting for less than 20% in their respective countries<sup>4</sup>



Less than 7% of tech positions in Europe are filled by women<sup>4</sup>



In the UK, Women in STEM management make up 11.5% of this sector<sup>2</sup>

Women make up only 14.4% of the UK STEM workforce<sup>2</sup>
